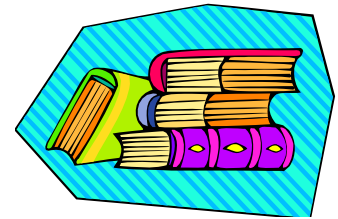


Good News from Dr. Bennett....Wednesday, Nov. 17th, 2010

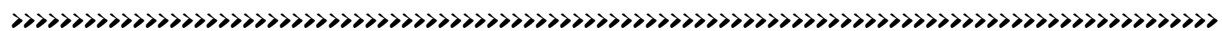
Man's Jacket Found at P/T Conferences
